Here are some activities you might like to do with your child at home - these are similar to what the children who are in school are doing.



Understanding the World

Planting seeds

If you are able to source some seeds, compost and 5 plastic cups/ yogurt pots, you can set up an investigation to see what seeds need to grow. Set up the five pots/cups as described:

How to set up the cup:	Cup 1: just the seed (no compost or water), put it somewhere light	Cup 2: plant a seed in compost, water it daily, put it somewhere light	Cup 3: plant a seed in compost, water it daily, put it somewhere dark	Cup 4: plant a seed in compost, don't water it, put it somewhere light	Cup 5: 'plant' a seed on tissue/cotton wool - water it daily and put it somewhere light
What happens to the seed? Write or draw in each box what happens in each cup/pot

Who does all the work?

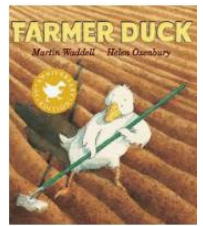
How do they feel?

Activity 2: On the sheet provided/paper, your child can draw some of the things that Grace enjoys doing in the story

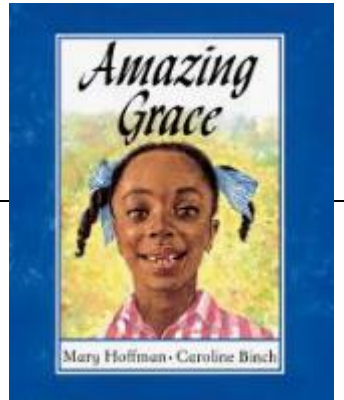
Activity 3 'Super Me': talk with your child/as a family, how are you the same or different to each other? What make each of you unique? What are you good at? What is special about you?
