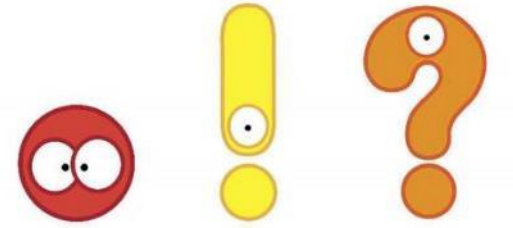


Perfect punctuation

My pet snake looks scary but really he's **harm**___.

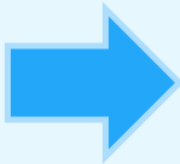
Clue: The number of dashes in each space DOES NOT tell you how long the word is.

We would love to come to your house for dinner.

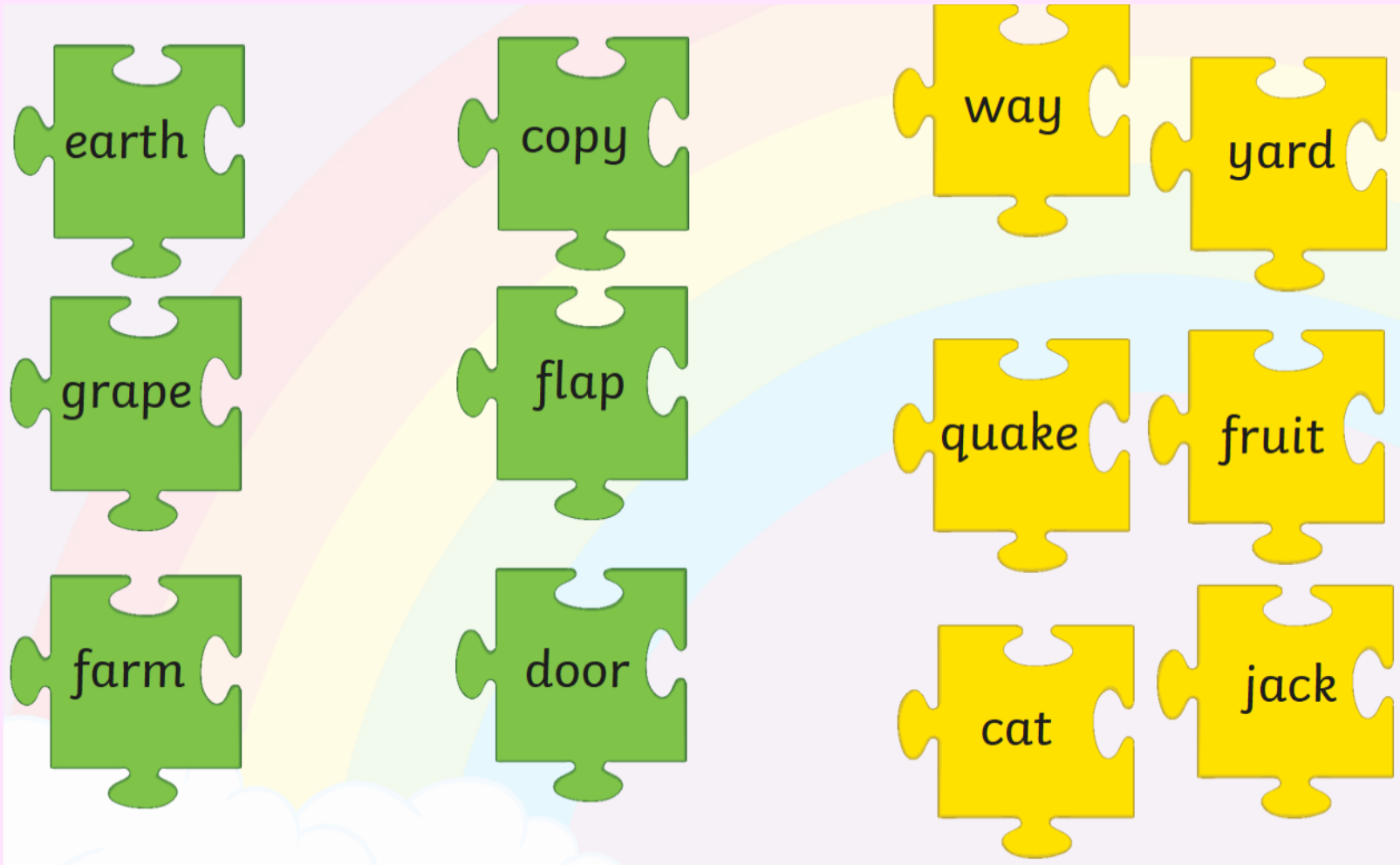
She is the smartest girl in the class.
