

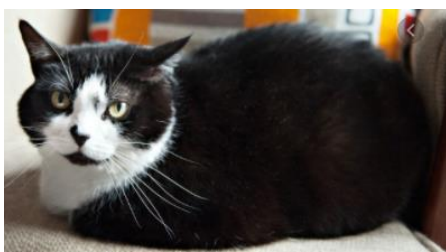
Year R Literacy w.b. 4/1/21- "Oi Frog!" BLUE group

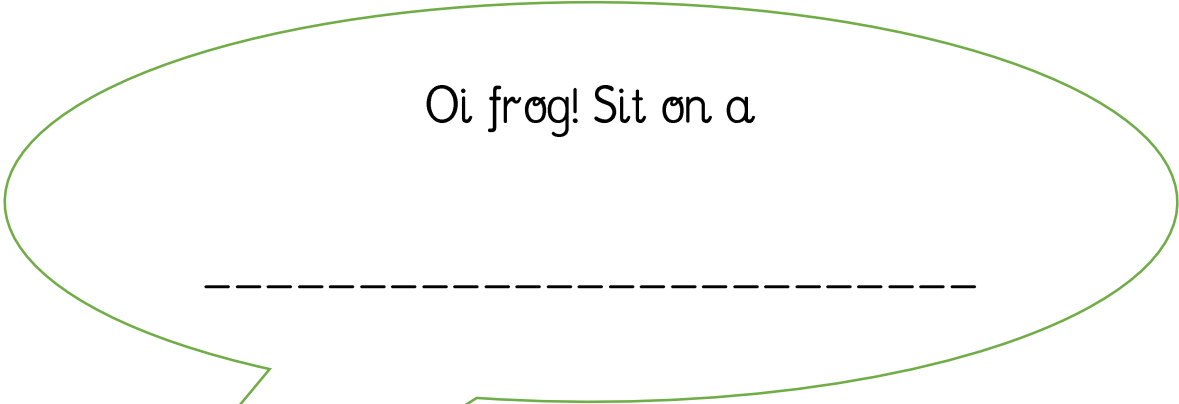
