You have been working hard to continue developing your skills to write sentences using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. As well as this you have been practising using the conjunctions 'and' and 'because' in sentences. You have used nouns and adjectives in your sentences and have been making sure that your sentences make sense. You have also been practising your handwriting.

Today we are asking you to write about one of the pictures completely independently, all on your own, so that we can see how well you are doing and help you with your next steps in your learning.

You will be using all of the writing skills you have been taught so far in school and all the practising you have been doing so far whilst learning at home. All we are asking is that you do your very best.

Choose one of the pictures below.

Think about the **nouns** (**objects, people/animals, places**) and **adjectives** (**words that describe the noun**) that go with the picture.

Write down as many as you can. (You do not have to print this; you can fold a piece of paper top to bottom to make two columns.)

Using the words, you have written down, write the story about the picture. Use the question as the top of the picture to help you with what you will write about.

Which tricky word can you use and spell correctly in your writing. There is a tricky words word mat on the website to help you.

Can you use a question in your writing with a question mark? (?)

Can you use an exclamation mark? (!)

Can you use the conjunction 'but' in a sentence?

You do not have to use all of the above, write a short story for the picture you choose using what you know.

It might help you to talk about your ideas with an adult in your house.


Read my story before you start. It might give you some ideas.
