On the day:


- Non-school uniform suitable for the weather.

*These trips are payable via MCAS under available trips. If you are entitled to Pupil Premium Grant support the cost of each event is reduced (this deduction is reflected in your MCAS account).

BEING LATE TO SCHOOL :-(

No-one likes to be late. Would you like to be late for a meeting and walk into a room of 30 people? This is what children face when they are late for school and the class is already settled and learning. This can be very distressing for some children. Add to this the time lost to the office staff who escort each late child to class to ensure there is someone in class to meet them. Each late child will then need to be spoken to individually by the teacher to catch up with what is happening in class - this then impacts on the other children's learning in the class.

The first bell rings at 8.50am and the expectation is that children are ready to enter the classroom at this time. There is 5 minutes allowed for entry into the classroom and then the second bell rings at 8.55am when classroom doors and the playground gate are closed to keep everyone safe.



SQUASH THE SQUASH - WATER ONLY

There should only be water in your child's drinks bottle in school. As well as causing tooth decay. squash drinks can cause a type of tooth wear called acid erosion. Most fruit flavoured drinks are acidic and so can soften the enamel and dentine in teeth so that they wear away.
