The children will need to apply the sun cream themselves so please help by teaching your child how to apply sun cream to their own bodies - avoiding eyes!


What better way to spend the recent inset day but in the sunshine picking up rubbish in Glenfield's beautiful grounds?

Bedwetting Guidance

<u>Bedwetting</u> (<u>enuresis</u>) is a medical condition which can be treated in children from age 5. Around 15% of all 7 year olds regularly wet the bed.

Join us for an evening webinar, led by a member of our Family Services Team to learn more about the causes of <u>bedwetting</u> and the treatments available to tackle this distressing condition. During this event, we will explain why night time wetting can persist even when daytime toileting is sorted.

Understanding the causes and the treatments available will help you decide what is right for your child – the right time to start working towards night time dryness, and the right treatment.

We will cover coping strategies for ongoing wetting and products available to help contain the wee.

The course is via zoom and is 6th June from 7pm -8.30pm.

Southampton School Aged Immunisation Team



Southampton has a dedicated School Aged Immunisation Team who focus on the prevention of the spread of illness and disease through immunisation. The team is made up of professionals who are highly skilled and experienced in giving vaccinations.

What do we do?

As well as educating, advising and promoting immunisations, we deliver the Routine National Childhood Immunisation Programme to school aged children across Southampton.

How does the service work?

At the appropriate time, a letter will be sent out electronically via your child's school. This letter provides parents/carers with a link to follow and a unique school code to enable parents/carers to complete a consent form electronically.

The nurse will check the consent form and may contact the parents/carers to clarify any health concerns.

At the arranged vaccination session the Nurse will again check the consent form and make sure your child is well and able to have the immunisation that day.

If a child misses their immunisation in school they can come along to one of our community clinics.

In the Autumn/Winter Term the Nasal Flu Vaccine is offered to all school aged children from Reception to Year 6. We are able to offer Year R, Year 6, 8 and 9 any missed MMR doses. If you would like help or have any queries regarding the vaccinations being offered, the School Aged Immunisation Team are more than happy to assist.
