

## PARKING ON THE ZIGZAGS IS DANGEROUS AND ILLEGAL!!!!!!

Unfortunately we have an unprecedented number of parents parking in the turning circle outside the school's entrances. The Highway Code states that you should keep these areas of zig-zags clear of stationary vehicles, <u>even if picking up or setting down children</u>.

<u>DO NOT PARK ON THE ZIG-ZAG MARKINGS</u> (including the turning circle) between the hours of 8am and 6pm - this is illegal and you will incur a fixed penalty notice if you are caught by the CCTV car.

<u>**Park considerately of our neighbours</u>** – don't block driveways, dropped kerbs only use disabled bays if you hold a blue badge exemption card.</u>

<u>Don't park on the pavement/verges</u> - this makes it unsafe for pedestrians who may be forced to walk on the road to get round your vehicle.

We appreciate your support in setting down or picking up your children away from the school boundary so that the entry or exit from school is safer for our children, their parents and our staff. Please allow enough time to park further away sensibly.

We have some families who have permission to use our car park for various reasons, if you don't have permission do not enter the car park.

We were delighted to welcome Joyce from Southampton City Mission who gave an assembly to Year 1 and Year 2 children.


They gave us a message to pass on to our families:
