Phonics and Reading

This week we will be learning the sounds ss. h. b. f. ff, l and ll and the HRS words pull, as and his. We teach children that the digraphs (two letters making one sound) ss, ff and ll usually appear at the end of words. They sound just the same as s, f and l.

Blending is the skill of putting sounds together and knowing what word they make. It is a vital reading skill. We want to suggest some games you can play at home to help your child grasp blending. This week play "I spy"

Place on the floor or on a table a selection of objects with one syllable names (e.g. zip, hat, cup, soap, boat, tap, ball, car). Check that your child knows the names of the objects. Say, "I spy with my little eye a z-i-p." Then invite your child to say the name of the object and hold it up. Encourage them to repeat the sounds and the word, "z-i-p, zip". Once your child has become familiar with this game use objects with names that start with the same initial sound (e.g. cat, cap, cup, cot, comb, kite). This will really encourage your child to listen and then blend right through the word, rather than relying on the initial sound.

Literacy




This week we will be reading the gorgeous story, "A cold dark night." This is about a

hedgehog looking for a home to hibernate in. You might want to talk to your child about animals which hibernate and consider making your garden or outside spaces welcoming to nature.

We are continuing to work on pencil grip and the movements needed to write all letters.

Maths

This week in Maths we will be focusing on the concepts of "more than" and "fewer than" and comparing quantities. Try to use the language of more and fewer when talking to your children. "Who has more pasta, child or Mummy?" Who has



more/fewer leddies on their bed, child or sibling?"
